CONTRIBUTION OF CAM

there is increasing evidence that CAM therapies may be used to relieve pain and improve disability in MSDs

-> Improving our ability to treat disease

CAM therapies seek to engender patient self-sufficiency, encouraging beneficial life-style changes instead of dependence on a particular drug or treatment

-> Ensuring individual empowerment for selfimprovement and self-management of healt

CONTRIBUTION OF CAM

CAM fulfils the criteria of patient-centred care that is respectful of and responsive to individual patient preferences, needs, and values, ensuring that the patient participates in all decisions regarding treatment


