

COVID-19

As autumn has made his appearance, most of the EU countries are experiencing the 'second wave' of COVID-19.

In the meantime, EUROCAM's support team has become accustomed to work from home and to participate in all relevant virtual meetings and events. We hope that the situation will go back to face-to-face meetings in Spring 2021 where we will have more opportunities to explain the role of CAM and Integrative Medicine in enhancing and maintaining citizens' health, as well as our contribution in preventative healthcare.

At the moment, we are working closely with EUROCAM's affiliated organisations & associate partners, EPHA, and the EU4Health Civil Society Alliance to make our voice heard in the European political arena.

We like to emphasise that our network at national level is also very important in advocacy work. This was particularly clear when the European Commission published its EU4Health Programme proposal and we had to mobilise our national network to create more impact.

Don't underestimate the effect of your voice or action! Our work is like ripples spreading out in the ocean, and can create a wave. Being an active part of the EUROCAM community means that you are part of the movement to put Integrative Medicine on the European Union agenda. This will, of course, have implications at national level in the future and will benefit practitioners and the availability of medicines.

EU4Health programme

As you have already read in EUROCAM's Summer newsletter, the European Commission has published its EU4Health programme proposal. As the following step, the ENVI Committee drafted a report with over 1,000 amendments from various MEPs including those submitted by EUROCAM. This huge number of amendments were then condensed to 10 compromise amendments which were all adopted. Encouraging items in these amendments are "One Health approach", "Health in all policies", "implementation of new care models", "enhancing the equal and timely access to quality, sustainable and affordable person-centred, outcome-based healthcare", "improving health literacy, patient rights and safety", "development of medicines that are intrinsically less harmful for the environment", "a holistic approach is needed to improve health outcomes" and "health promotion and health prevention are vastly more cost-efficient than treatment, both in terms of money and of quality-adjusted life years".

On 12 November, the report will be voted on in a plenary session of the Parliament. In the ensuing trilogue sessions with the Council, the final version of the EU4Health programme will be agreed on. We will probably see the outcome of that agreement by the end of the year.
